We are not in the power of blind fate, but of the God of mercy who allows us to plan our lives with him and treats us as responsible people at all times.

Some others may boast that they do not need God since they have not sinned. "I have not stolen, killed or quarreled with my wife. At work I am the best of colleagues. My religion is to be upright and to fear nothing." So he denies his need to be in contact with God. Do you realize that this attitude is dishonest and self-deceiving? Do you imagine that you have never sinned or done evil? The Bible tells you clearly that "There is no one righteous, not even one . . . all have turned away . . . there is no one who does good."

Meditate deeply on your life. Openly and honestly confess your sin. You have broken God's commandments and failed in love for others.

Praise God that he is alive. He created the world and keeps it. He commands the nations and reveals his glory in human history. He is all-powerful and can help us in great and small things. Study the history of the nations and learn that those who obeyed God's commands went forward.

God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses and these are the basis of the good life for everyone. He who neglects God's law is evil and the cause of much pain to himself and others. Have you ever wondered why kidnappings, murder, theft, etc., are becoming more frequent, and how sin takes shape in all kinds of degradation and scandal? The cause of this evil is that we have lost reverence for God and have neglected the commandments he laid down for all.
